("NCUA") has authority to issue a final Order where the Respondent consents to the issuance of

such an Order.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of

this Order, Baker Hughes Federal Credit Union shall pay the sum of \$471.00 by making payment

to the NCUA via the www.Pav.Gov website.

FURTHERMORE, all technical words or terms used in this Order have meanings defined in the

FCUA, the NCUA's Rules and Regulations, Title 12 of the United States Code, and any such

words or terms undefined in the foregoing have meanings that accord with the best customs and

usage in the credit union industry.

FURTHERMORE, this Order against Baker Hughes Federal Credit Union incorporates the referenced Stipulation, and the Order is effective upon its issuance.

STIPULATION AND CONSENT TO ISSUANCE OF AN ORDER OF ASSESSMENT OF CIVIL MONEY PENALTY

Baker Hughes Federal Credit Union, Houston, TX, ("Baker Hughes") and the National Credit Union Administration Board ("NCUA"), acting by and through its Director of the Office of Examination and Insurance, hereby make this Stipulation and Consent to Issuance of an Order of Assessment of Civil Money Penalty ("Stipulation").

Baker Hughes and the NCUA hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

1. Consideration. The NCUA is of the opinion that Baker Hughes violated 12 U.S.C. § 1782 of the Federal Credit Union Act ("FCUA"), and 12 C.F.R. § 741.6(a)(2) of the NCUA's Rules and Regulations ("Rules") by failing to timely file required reports due on January 28, 2018 covering the December 31, 2017 Call Report and Profile. Accordingly, the NCUA is of the opinion that grounds exist to assess a civil money penalty against Baker Hughes pursuant to 12 U.S.C. § 1782(a)(3). Baker Hughes, without admitting or denying that said grounds exist, except those set forth as to Jurisdiction in paragraph 2, desires to avoid the time, cost, and expense of administrative litigation. Accordingly, Baker Hughes consents to the issuance by NCUA of an Order of Assessment of Civil Money Penalty ("Order of Assessment") in consideration of the settlement, compromise, and resolution of all potential administrative claims and charges that

have been or might be asserted by NCUA against Baker Hughes arising out of its required filings under the FCUA and Rules for the period specified in the first sentence of this paragraph.

- 2. <u>J</u>urisdiction. Pursuant to its authority under the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. §§ 1782, 1786, the NCUA is the appropriate Federal agency to maintain an administrative action against an "insured credit union." Baker Hughes is an "insured credit union" within the meaning of the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. § 1752(7). Accordingly, Baker Hughes admits the jurisdiction of the NCUA over itself and the subject matter of this action.
- 3. Finality. Baker Hughes consents to the issuance of the Order of Assessment, and agrees to comply with all of its terms. This Stipulation is contingent upon Baker Hughes compliance with the resultant Order of Assessment, including timely payment of the civil money penalty. NCUA reserves the right to seek a higher assessment amount if Baker Hughes fails to comply with this Stipulation or the Order of Assessment. The Order of Assessment complies with all requirements oflaw, and issues pursuant to the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. § 1782(a)(3). Upon its issuance, the Order of Assessment is final, effective, and fully enforceable by the NCUA. The laws of the United States of America govern the construction and validity of this Stipulation and the Order of Assessment, and the section and paragraph headings do not affect the interpretation of this Stipulation or the Order of Assessment.
- 4. <u>Waivers.</u> Baker Hughes waives its right to an administrative hearing provided by the FCUA, 12 U.S.C. §§ 1782(a)(3), 17860), 1786(k)(2). Baker Hughes further waives its right to seekjudicial review of the Order of Assessment, or otherwise challenge the validity or legality of the Order of Assessment.
- 5. Other Actions. Pursuant to this Stipulation, Baker Hughes hereby agrees that the Order of Assessment is solely for the purpose of settling and resolving NCUA's claims against it,

as provided by paragraph 1, and does not release, discharge, compromise, settle, dismiss, resolve, or in any way affect any actions claims, charges against, or tiabilities that may be or have been brought by any other Federal or state government agency or entity other than the NCUA.

6. <u>Countemarts and Electronic Copies</u>. This Stipulation may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which toger ther constitute one and the same instrument. A facsimile version, photocopy, and/or an electronically scanned image of a signature shall be deemed an original and shall be enforceable as if it is an original signature.

WHEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, Baker Hughes Federal Credit Union: and the National Credit Union Administration Board execute this Stipulation and Consent io the Issuance of an Order of Assessment of Civil Money Penalty.
