Dear Gerald Poliquin,

I am writing on behalf of United Health Credit Union, which serves the community of Burlingame, CA and Mills-Peninsula Health Services. We have approximately 4500 Members and \$52m in assets. United Health CU appreciates the opportunity to provide comments to the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) on its proposed rule, Prompt Corrective Action – Risk-Based Capital.

I completely understand managing risk and that is what we have been asked to do through many channels. That would include adequately funding our Allowance for Loan Loss, based on the risk in our portolfio, Concentration Risk, identifying the level of risk we're declaring in policy as a percentage of net worth. It seems to me that this allows us to *manage our risk* and through our examinations if it's found that we have more exposure in any area, are asked or told, depending, to limit or stop a particular program. We experienced this first hand, being a participant in loans through Business Partners LLC. During an exam which followed the liquidation of Telesis CCU, we were directed to cease member business lending/participations, until they were X percent of our net worth. Completely understandable for a variety of reasons and we had no objection to this. This was based on Concentration Risk.

Now if I'm correct in my perception of what this proposal would do, it will take our *management of risk* and turns it to *managing our balance sheet*. I feel this doesn't take into consideration what a particular credit union's field of membership is or may need. Furthermore, the proposed NCUA authority to require even higher individual minimum capital requirements is overreaching.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this proposed rule and for considering our views on risk-based capital requirements.
