Dear Gerard Poliquin, Secretary of the Board, National Credit Union Administration:

The Abilene Teachers Federal Credit Union (ATFCU) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments concerning the National Credit Union Administration's (NCUA) plan to close the Temporary Corporate Credit Union Stabilization Fund. The Abilene Teachers Federal Credit Union (ATFCU) is a \$430 million credit union serving 46,000 members from its offices in Abilene, Texas.

ATFCU supports NCUA closing the Temporary Corporate Credit Union Stabilization Fund (TCCUSF or Stabilization Fund) as soon as possible. ATFCU hopes to see the return of its funds as soon as possible so they can be put to work for our members. Closing the TCCUSF in 2017 with a distribution in 2018 to credit unions is the most efficient and only legal way to transfer credit union funds back to credit unions. ATFCU prefers the rebate be paid as a Last-in, First-out (LIFO) basis to maximize the return to ATFCU's members.

ATFCU does not see the need to increase the current equity standard of 1.3%.
